c. Fellows who choose to audition for The United States Air Force Band in the future will be advanced to the semi-final live audition round with no pre-screening requirement (where applicable)

The Fellowship is open to any U.S. citizen completing their formal education or in the early stages of their musical career. Ideal candidates will bring a diverse background of musical and personal experiences. Fellowship positions are open to instrumentalists and vocalists In The United States Air Force Concert Band, Singing Sergeants, String Orchestra, Airmen of Note (jazz band), and Max Impact (rock band).
